NC GLOBAL DISTINCTION GRANTS FOR COMMUNITY COLLEGE FACULTY TO CREATE GLOBAL MODULES FOR THEIR COURSES

As part of the NC Global Distinction Program World View is providing grants funded by UNC National Resource Centers for college-based teams to create global modules for courses they teach. A module is a self-contained unit that infuses global content, context, and connections into the course. Key elements of a module are **Global Learning Outcomes, Student Learning Activities, and Resources**. Modules must contain 2-3 global learning objectives and at least 5 global student learning activities. These modules will be used by colleges in the NC Global Distinction program and will be made available to all colleges in the state through the World View website.

Two types of grants will be awarded, one for college teams and one for individual instructors. A college team will be comprised of 3 faculty or 2 faculty and 1 librarian. They will submit a proposal to create global modules for courses they teach. A team may create modules for 1-3 courses in the same or different disciplines. Each team member will receive \$750 upon completion of the module.

Individual instructors may apply to create a module for a course they teach. They will receive \$750 upon completion of the module.

Please note the following deadlines and details:

- Proposals accepted until all grant funds are awarded.
- Grants award notifications: one week after proposal submission.
- Based on proposals World View will arrange a one-day research visit to UNC for team members to work with UNC University Library area studies specialists, National Resource Centers, and appropriate faculty.
- Modules submission schedule will be determined on an individual basis.

Grants are available for modules covering the following world regions listed below.

- Africa
- Asia (Individual Grants Only)
- Europe and the European Union
- Latin America
- Middle East and Muslim civilizations (Individual Grants Only)



Pick one of the above world regions and create at least five student learning activities for countries in this region. These activities may include comparisons to countries in other world regions, but must focus on the world region you choose.

The following courses are not eligible for grant funding (they already have global modules from NC Global Distinction workshops).

- Communications 231
- Biology 110
- Economics 252
- English 111
- English 112
- History 131
- Math 143
- Math 152
- Psychology 150
- Sociology 210

Proposal Format

Please submit a 1-2 page proposal outlining your module using the attached proposal cover sheet for the world region you have chosen. The module template is below. You may supply as much of the template information as you wish, but **required information for the proposal includes:**

- Course number and title with a 2-3 sentence description of course.
- Possible ideas for 5 Global learning activities.
