

Activity #5: Global News Stories

1. Writing and Research in the Disciplines (ENG 112)
This course, the second in a series of two, introduces research techniques, documentation styles, and writing strategies. Emphasis is placed on analyzing information and ideas and incorporating research findings into documented writing and research projects. Upon completion, students should be able to evaluate and synthesize information from primary and secondary sources using documentation appropriate to various disciplines.
2. Global News Stories Lisa Stanley-Smith
Students will read and research news stories that exist in global societies and present their findings to the class to increase awareness of global news and the effects on local issues.
3. Objective:
The purpose of this activity is to help students understand different cultures and global issues through reading, increasing their awareness of global news stories.
4. Time:
Can be done daily or weekly
5. Materials:
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Access to news sources2. Computer and internet access3. Course Syllabus to keep track of assignments and dates4. Suggested resources for research are found at the end of this activity.
6. Procedure:
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Each student will read and research current global news stories.2. Each student will choose a date to present a global news story or a couple major global news events.3. Each student will respond to questions about the news.4. Each student will discuss the new story (or stories) they have chosen in class and make connections to local issues, such as oil prices in the Middle East and gas prices in their city.5. Each student will hand in a one page paper (or longer) summarizing what he or she has presented in class. The paper will include a bibliography of the news source used.
7. Assessment:
Students will be assessed on the following: -level of relevant detail in their presentation -ability to connect global news story to local issues -basic standards of presentation: organized content, audibility -paper adheres to grammatical and academic standards -papers uses proper citation -paper has a bibliography of the news source
