

Activity #1: Know your Human Rights!

Task: Prepare 2 digital slides for the human right(s) you were assigned 1) the human right with number and 2-3 key words that would help the class understand the article, plus a link to the audio recording and 2) photos or clipart to help reinforce the concepts of the human right; 3) . There are 30 articles of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, from the Document of the United Nations.

Options for groupings: Building background knowledge— In order to prepare for the photo analysis, each student in the class will be assigned one of the 30 articles. There are several options, 1) allow each student to select an article; 2) print out the articles and cut them into strips and have each student randomly draw one; or 3) allow students to work in pairs or small groups working with as many articles as necessary to have each one represented at least once in the class.

_____ highlight & define (suggested to do so in Spanish) key words that are crucial to comprehending the article (put a smaller picture to illustrate those words if possible),

_____ upload a vocaroo.com or other audio version of the actual article in the target language. If more than one student is preparing a slide all should say the text at once for the voice recording.

_____ For homework (flipped classroom) or in class, before engaging in the photo analysis, students will review the entire presentation, with the audio recording being read as the slide is shown.

_____ After viewing and listening to the presentation, every student will complete a 3,2,1 activity related to the human rights articles. 3 things learned, 2 articles you would like to investigate further, 1 idea for the human rights that are hardest to achieve universally and why.
