- 1. Use the Contemporary Tribes of NC Graphic Organizer provided by instructor.
 - a. Do not copy and paste information into the graphic organizer. All information must be in your own words.
 - b. Make sure that you fully answer each question. Some parts of the graphic organizer will require up to 2 paragraphs of a response.
- 2. Use Contemporary NC Tribes Research Links document to help you complete the graphic organizer.
- 3. When finished, submit your graphic organizer for a grade and feedback.

Part 3: Create Your Presentation


- 1. Create a Google Slides presentation about your tribe
 - a. Use your graphic organizer as a guide
 - b. Presentation length: 5-10 minutes
- 2. Slide breakdown:
 - a. Slide 1 = Title page
 - i. Tribe name
 - ii. Your name
 - b. Slide 2 = Tribe background
 - i. Give a background about the tribe including population, location, etc.
 - ii. Include at least one image
 - c. Slide 3 = Tribe history
 - i. Explain the tribe's history
 - ii. Include at least one image
 - d. Slide 4 = Tribe government
 - i. Explain the tribe's government
 - ii. Include at least one image
 - e. Slide 5 = Tribal issue
 - i. Explain one challenge the tribe faces today or has faced in the past and how it specifically relates to the tribe.
 - Use the <u>Contemporary NC Tribes Research Links document</u> to help discover a challenge unique to your tribe. Examples of an issue: retaining the language of the tribe, maintaining land, education, building community, financial issues, efforts to become a federally recognized tribe, etc.
 - 2. Be aware: each tribe deals with different issues. Use your research from the graphic organizer to help guide you.
 - ii. Include at least one image
 - f. Slide 6-7 = Issue Resolution
 - i. Explain what the tribe is doing or has done to remedy, change, or improve the situation
 - ii. Include at least one image

- g. Slide 8 = Self-Reflection
 - i. Answer:
 - 1. What did I know about this tribe before this research project?
 - 2. What was the most interesting thing I learned while researching this tribe?
 - 3. Why is it important that people learn about American Indians living in North Carolina, today and in the past?
- h. Slide 9 = Works Cited
 - Include a list of all of the specific websites that you used to complete the graphic organizer and this presentation.


Part 4: Record Your Presentation

Directions: Use Google Meet to record your presentation.


- 1. Make sure you are logged into your school account.
- 2. Have your presentation open in a browser tab.
- 3. Open a second browser tab, and go to https://meet.google.com/
- 4. Click on "New Meeting" and then "Start an Instant Meeting."
- 5. At the bottom of the screen, click on the three vertical dots, immediately to the left of the red hang-up button.



- 6. Click on "Record Meeting."
- 7. Then, at the bottom of the Google Meet screen, click on the "Present Now" icon



8. Click on "A tab" and then select the tab with your presentation.



- 9. Make your presentation full screen.
- 10. Begin your presentation.
- 11. When you are finished, click the red hang-up button.
- 12. In approximately 30-45 minutes, you will be emailed the recording of your presentation.
- 13. Log into YouTube.com using your school account.
- 14. Upload your video making sure that you change the view settings from "Public" to "Unlisted".
- 15. Post the YouTube link from your video to your instructor.
