- **Sustainability:**
 - the ability to be maintained at a certain rate or level.
 - "the sustainability of economic growth"
 - avoidance of the depletion of natural resources in order to maintain an ecological balance.
 - "the pursuit of global environmental sustainability"

Contamination (n):

- the action or state of making or being made impure by polluting or poisoning.
- Contaminate - verb

- the disposal of sewage and solid waste.
