## What If? An SDG Children's Book

Hello Students! In an effort to solve global issues, the United Nations created 17 goals for the nations of the world to reach by year 2030. The goals include subjects ranging from literacy to responsible use of resources to human rights! These goals are known as the Sustainable Development Goals or SDGs. <u>To learn more about the Sustainable Development goals</u>, click this link.

For this project, you will work by yourself or with a partner to create a children's book about an SDG in the country of your choice. The book will address what life is currently like and the progress the country has made in relation to the SDG you chose as well as what you envision life would be like if the SDG was achieved. This book will be read to the class.

## **Project Requirements:**

- The book must be **15 pages minimum**.
- At least 10 pictures (5 **must** be in color) must be included in the book.
- The book must have a cover with a title and illustration.
- Text should be clear and easy to read.
- A glossary of **at least 7** vocabulary words and their definitions must be included in the back of the book.
- All resources used for the project must be included on the Works Cited Page and written in correct APA format. This should be included in your Action Plan and in your presentation.

# Suggested tools to use: Book Creator, Google Slides, Keynote

## **Topics:**

- What life is currently like in the country
- The progress the country has made towards meeting the Sustainable Development Goal
- What life might be like if the SDG is achieved in the country

## Tips:

Keep these tips in mind as you create your children's book:

- All sources (information and pictures) must be included in the Works Cited page at the back of the book. You do not need to include any illustrations you created yourself.
- Organize all of your information in the order you want it to appear in the book before writing the story.
- Make sure the story flows logically and is interesting to read.
- Proofread your work.
- Make sure images reinforce the content of each page.
- Have another person read and give feedback on your story before turning it in.




