"Explaining the Most Pressing Challenge from the Viewpoint of a Subsistence Hunter"

***Teacher suggestion: Create a single-point rubric using the criteria from column #2. Have students show proof of exceeding the criteria listed in the column to the left and evidence of "not yet" in the column to the right. Simpler is better, and student accountability is enhanced.
