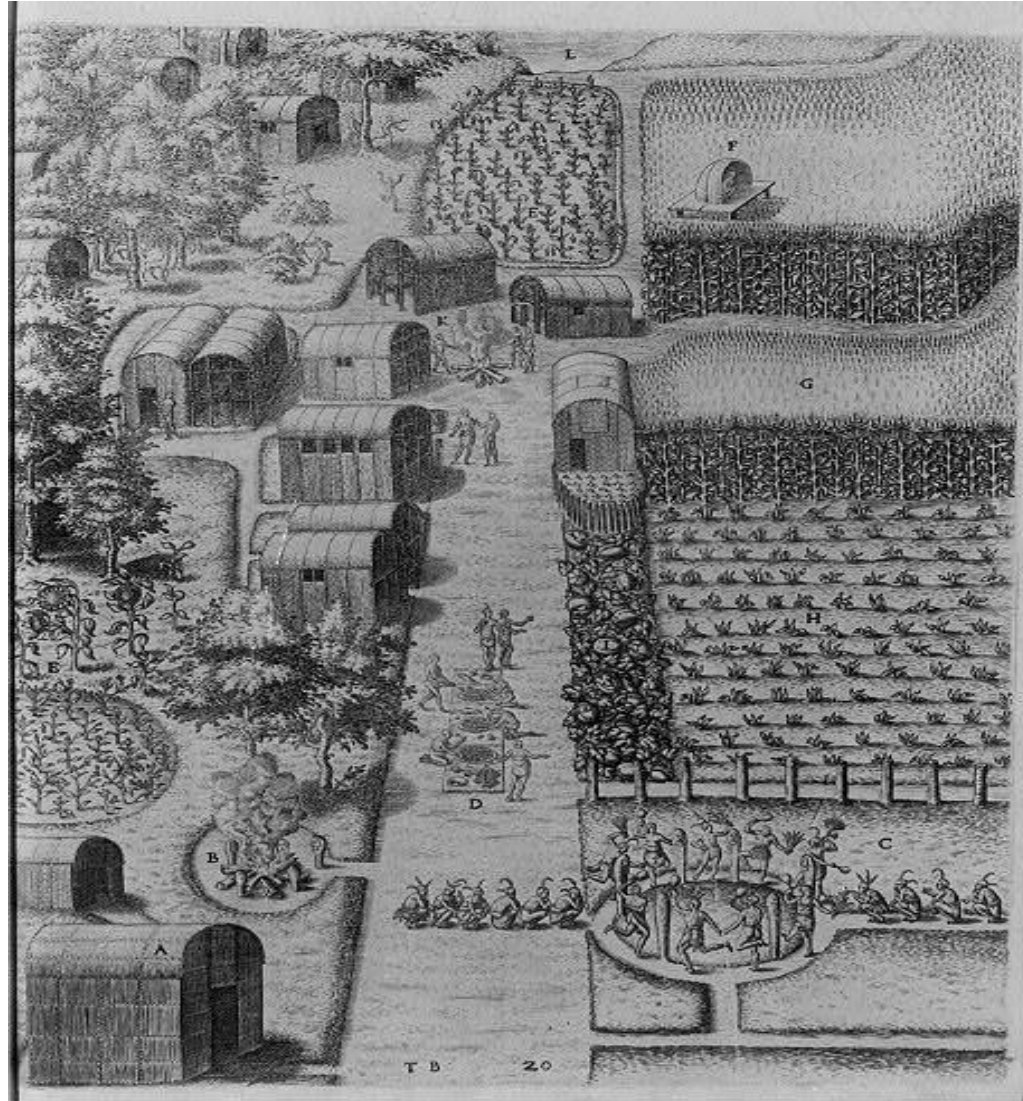

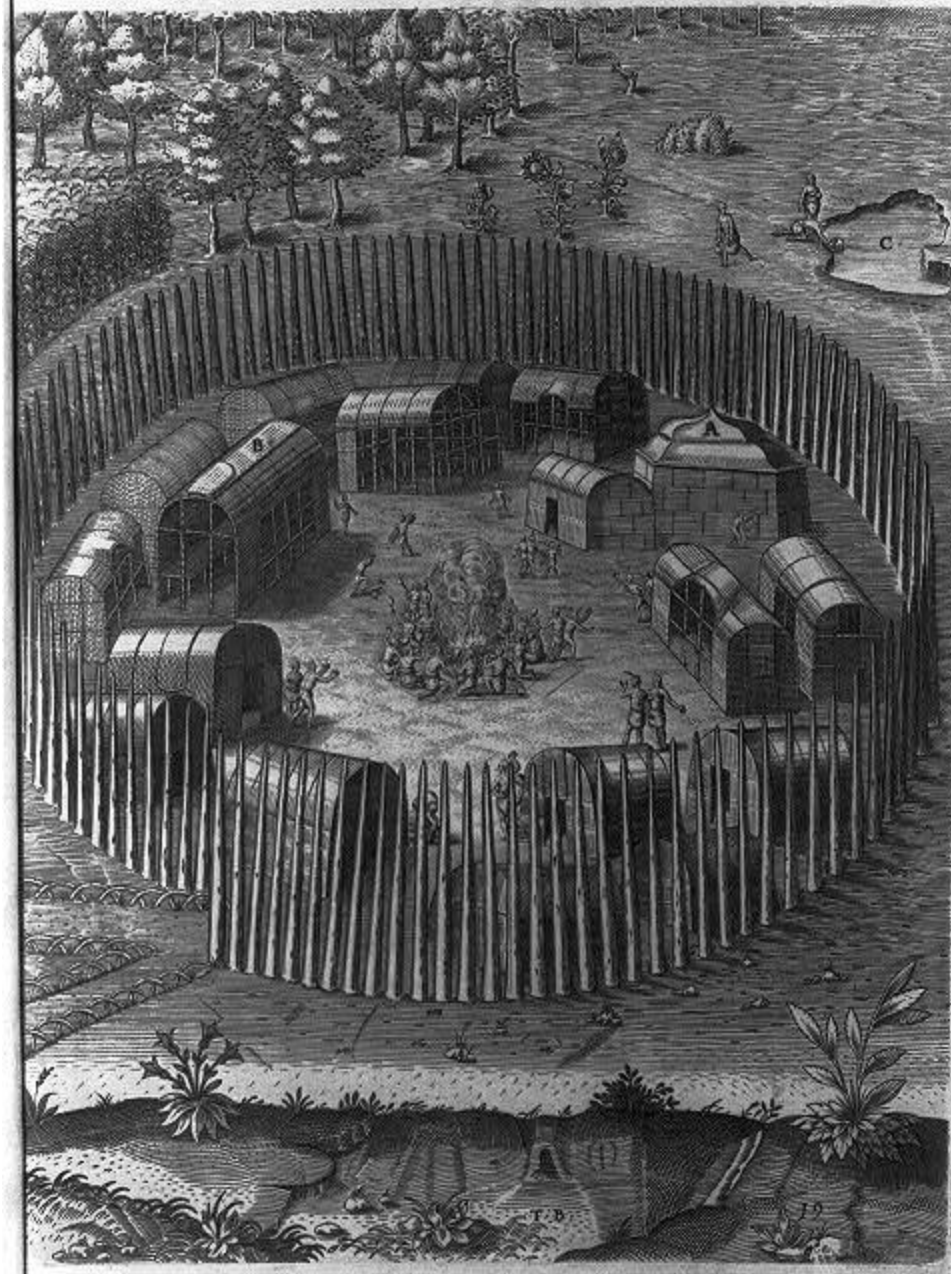
Village of Secotan

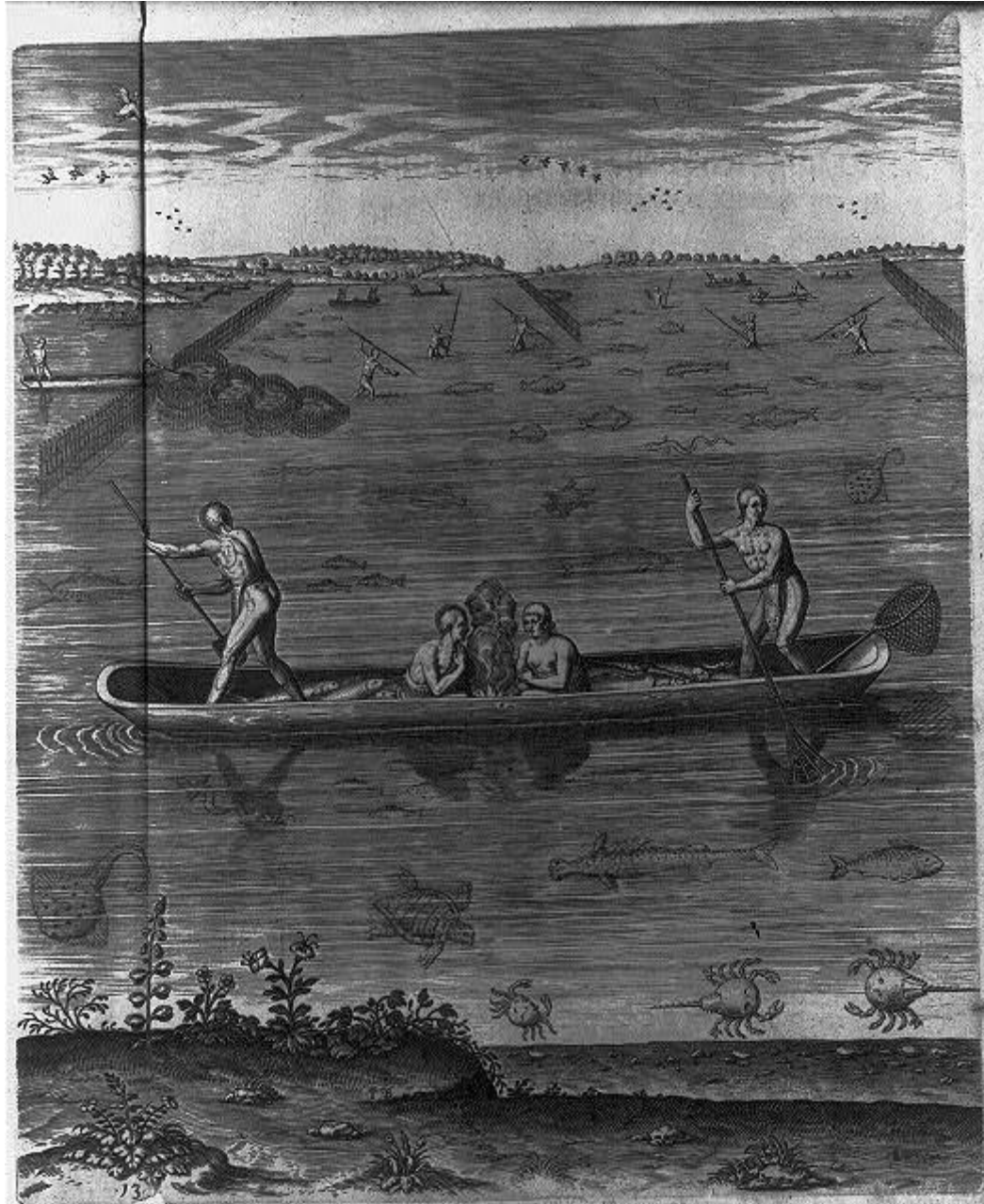

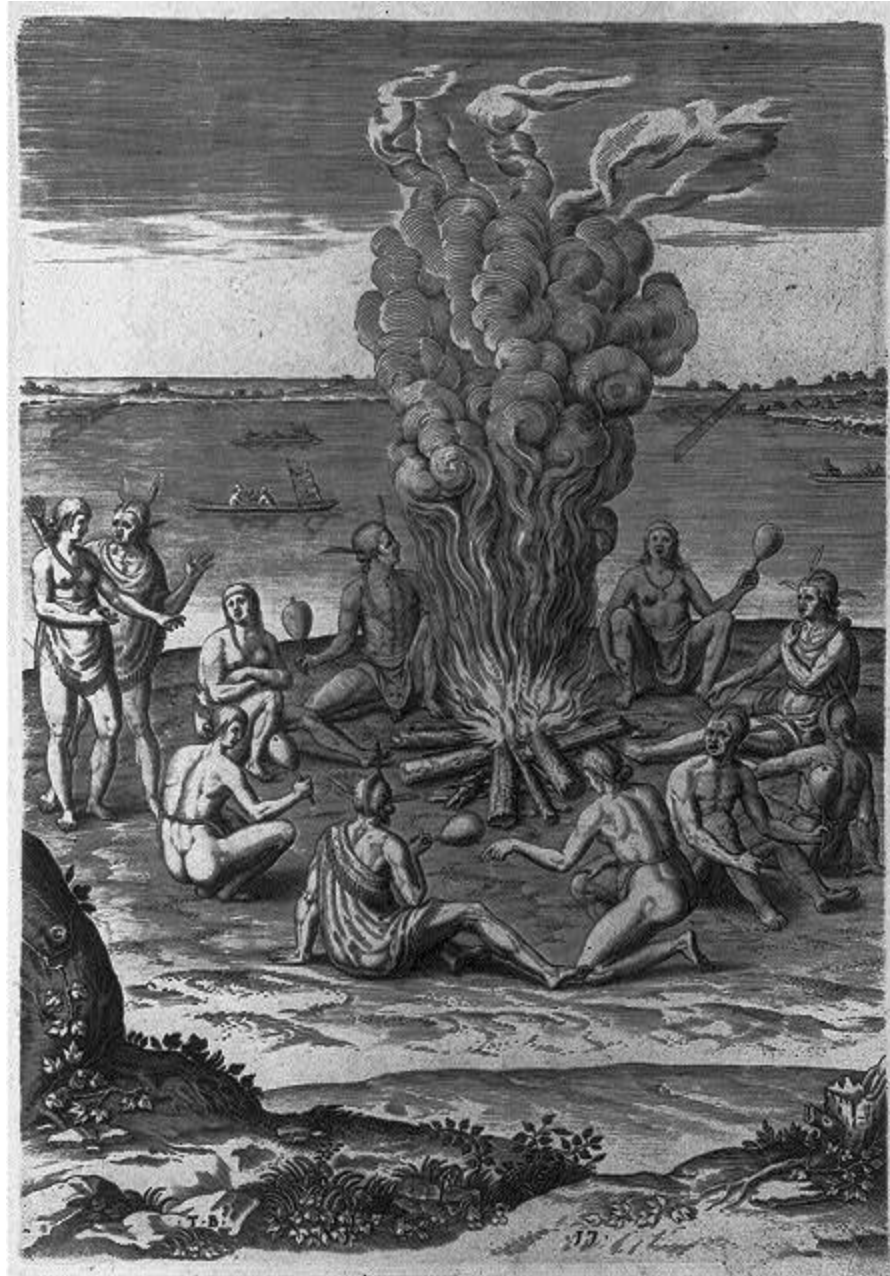

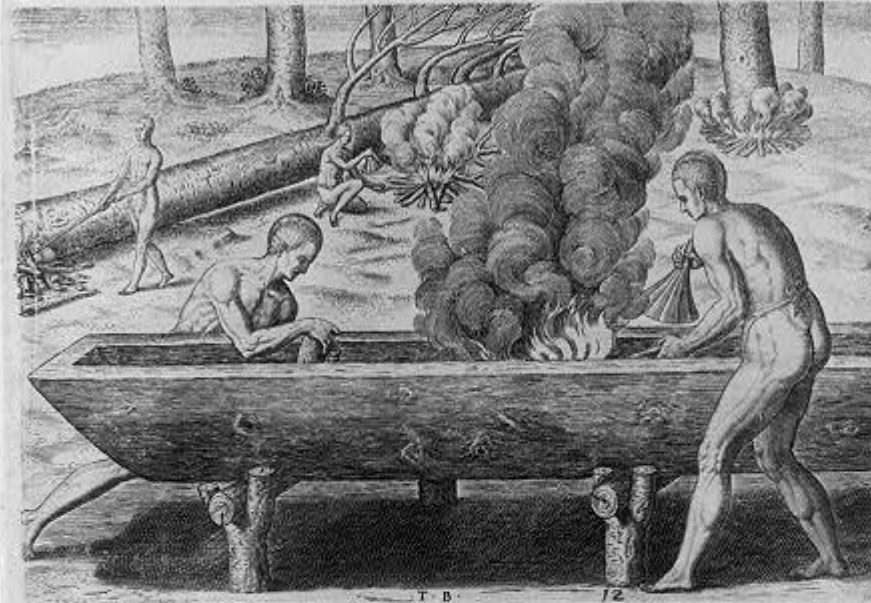
