## Indigenous Food Systems as Models for Conservation & Restoration Poster Project Description & Requirements

**Research project and poster work.** Research and poster completed in small groups (3-4 students). Each group will select a case study to explore:

**Case study 1:** <u>Kelp farming</u> on Long Island for coastal water quality and natural resources

**Case study 2:** <u>Three sisters farming practices</u> to restore soil, crop biodiversity and health

Review from previous units: <u>environmental impacts of conventional agricultural</u> <u>practices</u>

Case Study 3: <u>Tribal Salmon & Steelhead Co-management</u> Alternative: Lumi Nation Salmon conservation strategies

Case Study 4: <u>Reviving local food production systems in Hawaii</u>

Case Study 5: Ojibwe Wild Rice cultivation and wetland restoration

• \*Additional case studies may be selected by student groups to broaden choices; must be approved by teacher and demonstrate availability of robust suite of research resources for that case study

Identify the problem	Identify and describe the food system in 5-6 sentences (be concise!). Articulate the problem being addressed in this case study.	/5
	Identify any harmful land-use or agricultural practices at play (e.g., crop monocultures, deforestation, water quality degradation, dams, etc.).	
Describe the role of indigenous communities in this food system	Provide details of the food system restoration work, as generated by indigenous communities. Identify any key partners in this work.	/5

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Environmental and Cultural Impacts	Describe how the involvement of indigenous communities in this food system mitigates ecological impacts caused by conventional practices. Be as specific as possible about identifying the ecological impact(s). Identify any cultural significance of these efforts.	/5
Visual Presentation	Provide visual representation of the food system, as supported by indigenous practices. This may include photographs or a diagram. Label each image or figure with a one-sentence explanation (figure 1.:)	/5
Vocabulary list	Identify and define at least three key terms to support readers/viewers' understanding	/1
Work cited (APA format)	Complete list of APA citations in proper APA format	/2
Poster Intro for Gallery Walk	<ul><li>1 - 1.5 minute elevator pitch (keep it brief; you will have the opportunity to answer questions later).</li><li>Intro concisely summarizes key lessons.</li></ul>	/2
